Evaluating Your Accountability System

Ask the following questions about the current meal counting procedures. If the answer to any of these questions is "Yes", the counting procedures are **NOT** adequate and must be revised.

		Are claims based solely on meal or milk counts taken in the morning in the classroom or at any other location before the meal or milk is served?
		Are claims based on attendance records?
		Are meal or milk counts based on the number of tickets/tokens sold and distributed or the number of meals purchased in advance?
		Is the number of reduced price or free meals or free milk claimed based only on the number of children eligible to receive such meals or milk?
		Are meal counts taken without monitoring meals after the last food item is offered to ensure that the meals are reimbursable?
		Are meal counts based solely on visual identification of students with no back-up procedures available for persons not familiar with students (e.g. checklists)?
		Are meal counts based solely on tray or plate counts?
		Are back-out procedures used which subtract one number (e.g., number of reduced price and free eligible children) from the total count to get another number (e.g., the number of paid meals)?
