Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Clarification

CEP for the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program provides an alternative to household applications for free and reduced-price meals. Sites that elect this option agree to serve all students free lunches and breakfasts for up to four successive years and claim the meals based on a percentage of identified students multiplied by a factor of 1.6 to determine the percentage of free meals. If the percentage is less than 100 percent, the remaining percentage will be reimbursed at the paid rate. Districts with free direct certification rates between 25 and 62 percent may be required to pay, from sources other than federal funds, the costs of serving breakfasts and lunches that are in excess of the federal assistance received. Sites which have a 25% or greater percentage of free Directly Certified students are eligible for this option. Sites whose percentage is between 15.00% - 24.99% are potentially eligible.

Sponsors or a school or group of schools within the sponsor electing the Community Eligibility Provision for SY 24-25 must complete the Community Eligibility Provision Application in KN-CLAIM by June 30, 2024. Claim Update

School Finance will resume posting payments Tuesday mornings, allowing Sponsors to be paid via direct deposit on Fridays. SNP Claims, including National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), Afterschool Snack Program (ASP) and Special Milk Program (SMP) are posted typically the first three Tuesdays of each month. Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program (FFVP) Claims will be posted 1-2 Tuesdays each month as quantity of "Approved" claims warrants. Site and Sponsor Claims in "Approved" status by 8:00 a.m. each applicable Tuesday morning will be paid that week. Request to Use Electronic Transactions in Child Nutrition Programs

Sponsors who wish to use an online or accept electronic signatures on any child nutrition form, including the Consent for Disclosure, must complete the Request to Use Electronic Transactions in Child Nutrition Programs form located in Chapter 7 of Food Service Facts. The Request to Use Electronic Transactions in Child Nutrition Programs form must be completed annually and returned to CNW at cnw@ksde.org. Kansas Online Application for Free and Reduced-Price Meals

The Kansas Online Application for Free and Reduced Price Meals will be available free of charge to sponsors for the 2024-2025 school year. Sponsors opting to use the Kansas Online Application for Free and Reduced-Price Meals are not required to complete the Request to Use Electronic Transactions in Child Nutrition Programs form. Food Safety Inspections

All Sponsors are required to have two food safety inspections each year. If you have not received two (2) inspections by May 1, 2024, you must send a letter to the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) requesting the needed inspection(s). The date the letter is sent must be recorded on the Site Application during Program Renewal. The annual license fee covers the costs of the two required inspections. Remember that the most recent KDA inspection must be printed and posted in a location visible to the public.

Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program

The application to participate in the Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program (FFVP) for school year 2024-25 is available at https://cnw.ksde.org, SNP, SNP What's New. The FFVP provides all children in participating elementary schools with a variety of free fresh fruits and vegetables throughout the school year. It is an effective and creative way of introducing fresh fruits and vegetables as healthy snack options. Participation in the FFVP is limited to elementary schools, with priority given to schools with the highest percentage of students eligible for reduced price or free school meals.



To apply for the FFVP, complete the application and return it to KSDE no later than May 24, 2024. Schools selected to participate will be notified in July 2024. Participating schools will be reimbursed for their documented expenses on a monthly basis. If you have any questions, please contact Arleen Anderson at aanderson@ksde.org or 785-296-2276.

Summer Food Service Program Outreach

All SNP Sponsors are required to conduct outreach for the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). If the Sponsor does not have SFSP sites, consider posting a link to the site locator tool on the school website or providing the link on a flyer to send home with students. This would allow families to find a location to receive free meals at sites across Kansas. The site locator tool is available at https://cnw.ksde.org, SFSP, Locate a Site Near You.

Summer Meals Text Numbers and Hunger Hotline

The automated texting service which connects families to local summer meal sites is 914-342-7744. The USDA National Hunger Hotline number is also available. Individuals can call 1-866-3-HUNGRY or 1-877-8-HAMBRE to speak with a representative who will find food resources such as meal sites, food banks, and other nearby social services. Parents and caregivers can also text the word "FOOD" or "COMIDA" to 304-304 to find the nearest meal sites through the No Kid Hungry Hotline.

Seamless Summer Option (SSO) or Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) 2024

Summer Meals Programs are designed to fill the nutrition gap that occurs in summer and make sure children can get the nutritious meals they need. Many sites provide not just meals but also educational, enrichment, and recreational activities that help children continue to learn and stay safe when school is not in session. Summer meals act as a "magnet" to draw children to activities and activities draw children to summer meals. Meals can be served at a variety of locations, including schools, camps, parks, recreation centers, YMCAs, Head Start Centers, Community Action Agencies, Boys and Girls Clubs...and many other places. Now is the time to sign up or renew as a Summer Meals Sponsor. Sponsors that plan to operate the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) during May/June 2024 must update KN-CLAIM. The Seamless Summer Option in Summer 2024 resource provides instructions for the required KN-CLAIM updates for SSO election. It is posted at https://cnw.ksde.org, SNP, SNP What's New.

Sponsors Serving Summer Meals through Seamless Summer Option (SSO) in July and/or August

Sponsors that are serving summer meals through the Seamless Summer Option in July and/or August must complete and be approved for SY 24-25 operations PRIOR to July 1. While completing program renewal, Sponsors operating SSO in July and/or August must indicate "Seamless Summer Option Only" within the Summer Meals section of each site application that SSO summer meals will be served. Select and enter the Site Qualification information that reflects how the site qualifies to serve summer meals. Indicate the days in which meals will be served for July and/or August in the Operating Schedule table. Designate the days of operation and complete the meal service table specific for summer meal distribution. For rural sites, indicate if meals will be served non-congregate, congregate, or both.





11. Q. For sponsors proposing to provide both congregate and non-congregate meal services at the same site (hybrid), is it acceptable to offer a non-congregate meal during congregate meal service, if the non-congregate meal is intended for a different meal service time?

A. A non-congregate meal can be provided after a child receives and consumes their congregate meal. For instance, if a hybrid site plans to offer a congregate breakfast and a non-congregate lunch because they lack activities to keep children onsite for both meals, they could serve the congregate breakfast and then provide the non-congregate lunch as the children are leaving the site. However, it would not be acceptable to provide the non-congregate lunch and congregate breakfast simultaneously as outlined in Program regulations at 7 CFR 225.6(h)(4)(ii). Additionally, the sponsor must have a system in place to prevent meal service overlap, ensuring children do not receive more than the maximum daily meal allowance as required in 7 CFR 225.16(b)(3). In the above example, participants should be informed that the meal being provided is intended to be consumed for lunch that same day.

25. Q. Could adults other than parents or guardians and with written permission on file from the household pick-up meals on behalf of parents or guardians?

A. No, only parents or guardians may pick-up meals on behalf of their children (7 CFR 225.16(i)(2)). Other adults (i.e., proxies) may not pick up meals without the child(ren) present.

27. Q. Is it permissible for a childcare provider, such as a day care operator or childcare center operator, located in a rural area to collect meals for the children who attend their childcare services?

A. No, childcare providers cannot collect Program meals on behalf of parents or guardians for children attending their childcare. Childcare providers who care for whole groups of unrelated children formally enrolled in their care should not be considered guardians under the State agency's definition. Allowing a childcare provider to collect and distribute meals on behalf of groups of children introduces significant integrity risks, especially concerning meal duplication, ensuring meals reach eligible children, and food safety risks during transportation, storage, or distribution. In cases where children in childcare settings could benefit from non-congregate meals, FNS strongly encourages State agencies and sponsors to collaborate with local childcare providers. They should explore the feasibility of these providers becoming summer meal sites or participating in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) to support meals for children in their care.

28. Q. What are examples of documented procedures sponsors can use to prevent duplication of meal services when offering parent or guardian meal pickup?

- A. Program regulation at 7 CFR 225.16(i)(2) require that sponsors choosing to distribute meals to parents or guardians on behalf of their children must, through documented procedures, approved by their State agency, ensure that meals are only distributed to parents or guardians of eligible children and that duplicate meals are not distributed. Some possible strategies for enhancing integrity include, but are not limited to:
 - Requesting parents and guardians provide their children's names or other identifying information when picking up meals,
 - Using rosters or sign-in sheets,
 - Cross-referencing sign-in sheets, such as for a sponsor with multiple sites in close proximity, and



 Using technology-based solutions, such as QR codes for sign-in sheets or a registration system.

When developing procedures, sponsors should consider the proposed site type (e.g., open, closed) and whether the proposed system is appropriate or could potentially hinder access for eligible children. In addition, sponsors may review site meal counts daily to track trends and identify anomalies such as block claiming and over claims.

30. Q. Can non-congregate home delivery service be provided at addresses where the child does not reside?

A. No. As outlined in Program regulations at 7 CFR 225.14(d)(6), non-congregate meal delivery should only be sent directly to a child's residence with prior written consent from a parent or guardian. Non-congregate home delivery may not be sent to daycare home programs, short-term rentals, or vacation properties.

Professional Development Update
